

<u>Sentence Type</u>	<u>Sentence Structure</u>	<u>Example</u>
Simple	<u>1</u> Independent Clause (IC)	I watched <i>Jersey Shore</i> last night.
Compound	<u>2</u> or more independent clauses, joined with a <i>semicolon</i> or <i>comma+conjunction</i> (IC;IC or IC,conjunction IC)	I watched <i>Jersey Shore</i> last night, but I didn't think it was a very good episode.
Complex	<u>1</u> independent clause + at least <u>1</u> dependent clause (IC +DC or DC+IC)	I watched <i>Jersey Shore</i> last night <i>because</i> I find Snooki entertaining.
Compound-Complex	<u>2</u> or more independent clauses+ at least <u>1</u> or more dependent clauses (some combination of DC+IC+IC)	I watched <i>Jersey Shore</i> last night <i>because</i> I find Snooki entertaining, but I am not a big fan of the Situation.
