

Pronouns

Personal Pronouns

(1st person)--	I, Me, My, Mine, We, Us, Our, Ours
(2nd Person)--	You, Your, Yours
(3rd Person)--	He, Him, His, She, Her, Hers, They, Them, Their, Theirs, It, Its, Who, Whom, Whose

What pronoun is used depends on the case

(Subjective/Nominative)	I, You, She, He, They, We, It, Who
(Objective)	Me, You, Him, Her, Them, Us, It, Whom
(Possessive)	Mine, Yours, His, Hers, Theirs, Ours, Its, Whose

Relative Pronouns

A person)--	Who, Whom, Whoever, Whomever
<u>Subjective/Nominative case</u>	Who, Whoever
<u>(A place, thing or idea)--</u>	Which, That
<u>(Restrictive)--</u>	That
<u>Nonrestrictive)--</u>	Which
(Compound)--	Whatever, Whichever

Indefinite Pronouns

Always singular	Another, Anyone, Anybody, Anything, Everyone, Everybody, Everything, Nothing, Each, Either No One, Neither, Nobody, One, Someone, Somebody, Something
Always plural	Both, Few, Many, Several
Either plural or singular	All, Most, None, Some

Demonstrative Pronouns

(Singular demonstrative pronoun)--	This, That
(Plural demonstrative pronoun)--	These, Those

Interrogative Pronouns

(Interrogative pronoun)--	Who, Whom, Which, What, Whose
Remember:	Who = Subject
	Whom = Object

Reflexive Pronouns

• Always singular	myself, himself, herself, yourself, itself
Always plural	ourselves, themselves, yourselves
