

## Pronouns

### Personal Pronouns

<b>(1st person)--</b>	I, Me, My, Mine, We, Us, Our, Ours
<b>(2nd Person)--</b>	You, Your, Yours
<b>(3rd Person)--</b>	He, Him, His, She, Her, Hers, They, Them, Their, Theirs, It, Its, Who, Whom, Whose
What pronoun is used depends on the case	
<b>(Subjective/Nominative)</b>	I, You, She, He, They, We, It, Who
<b>(Objective)</b>	Me, You, Him, Her, Them, Us, It, Whom
<b>(Possessive)</b>	Mine, Yours, His, Hers, Theirs, Ours, Its, Whose

### Relative Pronouns

<b>A person)--</b>	Who, Whom, Whoever, Whomever
<b><u>Subjective/Nominative case</u></b>	Who, Whoever
<b><u>(A place, thing or idea)--</u></b>	Which, That
<b><u>(Restrictive)--</u></b>	That
<b><u>Nonrestrictive)--</u></b>	Which
<b>(Compound)--</b>	Whatever, Whichever

### Indefinite Pronouns

<b>Always singular</b>	Another, Anyone, Anybody, Anything, Everyone, Everybody, Everything, Nothing, Each, Either No One, Neither, Nobody, One, Someone, Somebody, Something
<b>Always plural</b>	Both, Few, Many, Several
<b>Either plural or singular</b>	All, Most, None, Some

### Demonstrative Pronouns

<b>(Singular demonstrative pronoun)--</b>	This, That
<b>(Plural demonstrative pronoun)--</b>	These, Those

### Interrogative Pronouns

<b>(Interrogative pronoun)--</b>	Who, Whom, Which, What, Whose
<b>Remember:</b>	Who = Subject
	Whom = Object

### Reflexive Pronouns

<b>• Always singular</b>	myself, himself, herself, yourself, itself
<b>Always plural</b>	ourselves, themselves, yourselves
